A thorough documentation of the Japanese paper tradition, both historically and in contemporary times. The making of koyo papers in the home studio is well illustrated with step-by-step photographs and diagrams.

Bell, Lillian, Plant Fibers for Papermaking, Lilicean Press, McMinnville, Oregon, 1981.

Includes detailed instructions on using a wide variety of plant materials for making paper. Descriptions of each plant include identification drawings and suggested recipes for making pulp.

Hughes, Sukey, Washi: The World of Japanese Paper, Kodansha, International, New York, 1978.

A sumptuous, expensive volume with photographs of papermaking in Japan and detailed descriptions of the lives and craft of papermakers as documented by Hughes who lived and studied Japan for several years.

An historical overview of papermaking world-wide with special emphasis on European traditions and watermaking. Hunter conducted well-traveled research on hand-papermaking for most of his career. This Dover publication is very affordable.

Chemical theories and applied techniques for coloring pulps with natural and synthetic dyes and pigments. Useful guide for advanced coloring processes.

Long, Panlette, ed. Paper: Art and Technology, World Print Council, San Francisco, 1979.

A collection of technical papers, and a variety of writings on papermaking plus a selection of artworks by numerous artists using this medium.

Studley, Vance, The Art and Craft of Handmade Paper, Van Nostrand Reinhold Co., New York, 1977.

A general overview of papermaking with lots of illustration and suggestions for pursuing this craft in the home or studio.

Turner, Silvie and Skiöld, Birgit, Handmade Paper Today, Lund Humphries Publishers, Ltd., London, 1983.

A thorough survey of hand mills now in operation world-wide including production sheet making workshops and artists' facilities and artworks.
